Safe farm transport and deliveries – driving safety forward Thursday 02 November 2017 Askham Bryan College, Askham Bryan, York, YO23 3FR 09.30–16.00

The IOSH Rural Industries Group, with support from the IOSH Food and Drink Industries Group, is pleased to announce this networking event, organised on behalf of the Farm Safety Partnership (FSP). Working together with the Agricultural Industries Confederation (AIC), this event is intended to identify hazardous activities and to share and raise awareness of good practice.

#### **Event overview**

Agriculture continues to have the highest fatality incidence rate, with injuries and ill health also causing concern. A high proportion of fatalities occur during on-farm and on-road farm transport, particularly during deliveries and collections of produce to and from farms and fields.

This event will raise awareness of good practice, with the aim of helping to reduce the toll of fatalities, injuries and ill health in the farming industry, as well as those involved in the transport and supply chain. It is also intended to encourage joint working and production of further guidance, information and future initiatives.

#### What's in it for you

This event will highlight the recent fatalities involving HGVs visiting farms, on-farm hazards, road work using farm tractors/trailers, the latest guidance, improved vehicle design/safety features, driver/visibility and reversing aids, as well as the safety of pedestrians, safe loading of vehicles, avoiding contact with overhead power lines and tractor/trailer maintenance for safe use.

Through a series of presentations and practical demonstrations, this event will be beneficial to anyone who manages transport to, from and between farms, fields, storage and pack houses, suppliers' depots or processors. It will also:

- provide information and guidance on good practice
- raise awareness (and use) of the 'Safe Deliveries' guidance and checklist for farmers and drivers
- highlight main causes of fatalities, injuries and ill health
- provide an update on emerging issues, relevant legislation, standards, technology and good practice
- help delegates to identify their own priorities, training needs and possibilities for contributing to the production of further guidance, information and initiatives.

#### Who should attend

This event is aimed at members of both the IOSH Rural Industries Group and IOSH Food and Drink Industries Group, but is also open to non-members and anyone who works in farming, the agricultural transport and supply industry, and the food manufacturing/supply chain.

Helping us to deliver this event on behalf of the Farm Safety Partnership, we are also pleased to be working in conjunction with the Agricultural Industries Confederation, which is the agri-supply industry's leading trade association, representing several sectors within the agri-supply industry, including animal feed, crop protection and agronomy, fertilisers, grain and oilseed, and seed.
