JOB DESCRIPTION

Main purpose and scope of job:

- To ensure that every sample taken from a load of sugar beet is sampled to agreed procedures.
- To verify and record that all weigh-bridges and automatic beet samplers are operating to agreed specifications.
- To be onsite at the start and end of beet intake.
- Record and report activities and issues throughout the shift to the Beet Intake Manager (BIM).
- Report any non-compliances to the British Sugar charge-hand and BIM.
- Has the authority to stop sampling should there be a major non-conformance.

Functional and Managerial responsibilities:

- To liaise and co-operate with British Sugar employees, beet growers and delivery drivers.
- To complete the daily reports and email to the BIM.
- To record grower complaints and email or send to the BIM office.
- To promptly report all problems, in particular equipment failure, to the BIM
- To comply with NFU and British Sugar's Health and Safety procedures.
- To witness all rejected loads and record details.
- To monitor and record overweight loads.
- To report any change in the quality of beet being rejected to the BIM.
- To report and record non-compliance of agreed procedures to the BIM.
- To report and record details of instances when sample integrity is compromised to the BIM.
- To follow up corrective actions to ensure they have been satisfactorily completed.
- To write up an end of campaign report.
- To work in accordance with NFU Sugar procedures.

General

- To perform such duties as the NFU may reasonably require or circumstances dictate and for which he/she is reasonably qualified or trained.
- To ensure compliance with NFU policies.
