FOR FREE TRADE AGREEMENTS (FTAs)

UK farming produces some of the world's best food and our farmers want to embrace the opportunities that free trade deals will deliver. **To do that, we need:**



A comprehensive agri-food strategy to improve productivity as well as increase exports

What this looks like:

- A minister for agri-food trade and competitiveness to work across government and with the devolved administrations.
- Government match-funding for existing industry investment in developing and entering new markets at home and abroad.
- An ambitious strategy for growing exports including:
 - 1. More agricultural counsellors in our embassies
 - 2. A UK export council to coordinate the strategy
 - 3. A review of the marketing and promotion of "Brand Britain" abroad
- A dynamic approach to domestic farm policy that supports improvements in on-farm productivity and competitiveness, which aligns with trade policy to reflect changing market conditions.

A response from government to the Trade and Agriculture Commission's (TAC) report of March 2021

The government must:

- Be transparent and respond to all of the TAC's recommendations from March 2021.
- Commit to setting out a list of core standards, as recommended, that would be safeguarded in future trade deals.
- Clearly articulate the government's approach to supporting high environmental and welfare standards at home and abroad through its trade policy

A rolling review process for future FTAs, ahead of negotiations and once implemented

- Every FTA should be assessed annually to provide a clear picture of its impact on imports, exports, farmgate and consumer food prices, and the UK's ability to feed itself.
- The cumulative impact of proposed FTAs must be modelled and published, ahead of any further deals being finalised.
