A NEW OUTLOOK ON INTERNATIONAL TRADE - NEW NFU REPORT

The NFU is calling for a razor-sharp political focus on markets at home and abroad for the UK's £13.8bn worth of food and drink exports. In <u>A New Outlook on International Trade</u>, the latest in a series of reports on the NFU's <u>Vision for the Future of Farming</u>, the NFU highlights the risks and opportunities for agriculture in trade deals fundamental to the industry's future.

BLUETONGUE IN NORTHERN FRANCE

Livestock producers should keep an eye on the Bluetongue serotype 8 which is currently circulating in France, including two positive animals being identified in another part of northern France. As it is only 150km from the South Coast of England. As a midge-borne disease Defra is working with the met office and modelling the weather etc. to identify any change in risk. Current advice to farmers is that they need to discuss what is appropriate for their farm (potentially vaccination) with their vet. As a notifiable disease, if they do have any suspicion of disease it must be reported immediately to the Animal and Plant Health Agency (APHA) on 03000 200 301. More details here at NFU Online

NEW METALDEHYDE STEWARDSHIP GUIDELINES FOR 2017

The Metaldehyde Stewardship Group has launched an enhanced campaign for 2017 to ensure maximum protection of the environment, and in particular birds, small mammals and water. The steps are straightforward to implement and will have significant impacts on the future of metaldehyde availability. This includes the introduction of a 10m no spread zone next to watercourses and all field boundaries. Ferric phosphate can be applied on these margins if needed. Read our briefing document here.
