EAST MIDLANDS MEP ANNOUNCES RETIREMENT

East Midlands UKIP MEP Roger Helmer has announced his retirement from the European Parliament, effective as of July 31, 2017. Mr Helmer was first elected to the European Parliament in 1999, as a Conservative. He was reelected in 2004 and 2009. In 2012, unhappy with the Conservative position on the EU issue, he crossed the floor to join UKIP, and was elected again as a UKIP MEP in 2014. He retires at the age of 73, after serving 18 years in the parliament.

ALLOW PLENTY OF TIME FOR YOUR ANIMAL TRANSPORT AUTHORISATIONS RENEWAL

The NFU has recently reminded members to check animal transport authorisations and to allow plenty of time for renewal, if required. Members have asked for clarification as to whether separate authorisations are needed for each business they operate in. We asked the Animal and Plant Health Agency (APHA) for clarification. APHA have confirmed to us that each legal entity which is engaged in transport operations requires a separate animal transporter authorisation. This means that if a farmer is operating as a sole trader and transporting animals he will need an animal transporter authorisation in his name. If the same farmer also transports as part of a partnership or as a limited company, authorisations for each separate business entity will also be required in the name of the business entity concerned. GREENING UPDATE - NOT GOOD NEWS

On Wednesday the EU Parliament voted <u>not</u> to block proposed changes to greening and other elements of BPS rules. Therefore the ban on the use of Plant Protection Products on field based EFA options (fallow / catch / cover crops and nitrogen fixing crops) will now come into force. No timescale is given at this stage. The EU Parliament's Agriculture Committee's resolution objecting to the EU Commission's legislative changes were rejected as it did not win support of an absolute majority of all MEPs, i.e. at least 376 votes. Parliament voted by 363 votes in favour of the veto, 267 against and 43 abstentions, not enough to stop the changes from entering into force. This is a disappointing outcome and attention now turns to how the changes will be implemented. In our discussions with Defra and the RPA this will include includes minimising the impact of the ban of PPPs on field based EFA options. Perhaps the most pressing issue is to know when the proposals will come into force from – 1 January 2018 or 2019. Equally, publication of RPA / DEFRA guidance will be needed very soon to help farmers. At this stage the NFU suggests you plan for the ban of PPPs on EFA on field based EFA options to come into force for BPS 2018.

FARMERS AND GROWERS URGED TO JOIN CAMPAIGN TO SAVE SEED TREATMENTS

Farmers and growers are being urged to explain the vital role neonicotinoids play on farm to their MPs and MEPs, and via social media, to highlight the impact a proposed ban would have on UK farming. The European Commission has put forward proposals that would effectively ban all uses of three neonicotinoids – clothianidin, imidacloprid and thiamethoxam – on all outdoor crops. Speaking at Cereals 2017 this week, Dr Chris Hartfield, NFU Acting Chief Science and Regulatory Affairs Adviser, said such a ban would affect around one million hectares of arable crops, including cereals and sugar beet, where there are no effective alternatives to neonicotinoid seed treatments. It would also affect a significant area of vegetable crops. To highlight the consequences of a ban and to help with lobbying work the NFU has produced a new leaflet – <u>Save our Seed Treatments.
